Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. AMEN.

To receive a wine pack (with a wafer and wine), take one off the platter and serve yourself.

Discard the pack as you return to your seats.

To receive a wafer instead, hold out your hands as shown, and the priest will place the wafer into your palm.

Two options to receive the wine.

To sip from the common, simply reach out to guide the large cup to your lips.

To dip your wafer hold it up in front of you until the small chalice comes to you. Then dip your wafer into the chalice.



New Sunday School Course Kicks Off April 24th

“Church History: Through the Eyes of Saints”

It made clear that God has been at work for all that time. God isn’t surprised at the rise and fall of nations and empires. God has seen it ALL before, and God still works with it for our good. It put things into perspective.




If you've been thinking that you'd like to learn to throw an AXE. Or just thinking it'd be fun to hang out with some guys, then this is for you.
